

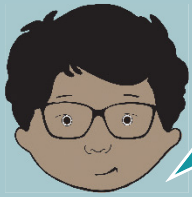







Who should see an Orthoptist?

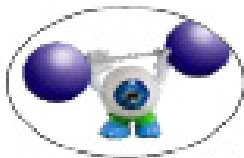
| If you experience: | If you see: |
|---|--|
| Double vision  | Strabismus (eye turn)  |
| Blurred vision – not corrected by glasses  | Ptosis (droopy eyelid)  |
| Visual field loss  | Nystagmus (continuous uncontrolled eye movements)  |

For an appointment you can ask your GP, health visitor, optometrist or hospital consultant for a referral to the Orthoptist at the eye (ophthalmology) clinic.

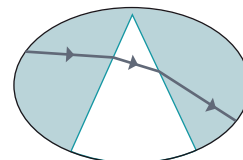

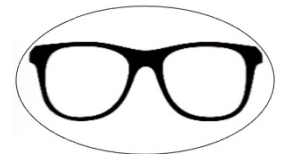

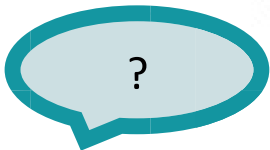
