- **Minutes**

The Minutes of the BOSTU AGM held on 21 June 2023 were proposed as a correct record by Claudine Wallace, seconded by Julie Dowdney and approved unanimously.

- **Chair's Report**

Deborah Podmore presented the General Secretary's report, noting the continuing support BOSTU provide to members, including 16 formal cases in 2023, and national representation across four countries.

- **Accounts**

Steve Doughty, representing TC-Kent, presented the Accounts via a pre-recorded video. BOSTU reported a surplus of £84,350 in 2023.

A question was asked relating to the relationship between the BOSTU accounts and those of BIOS, in particular what happens to a surplus on the BOSTU accounts. It was confirmed that the BOSTU budget was included within the BIOS accounts and therefore any surplus would be reflected in these.

There were no further questions on the Accounts.
